

- Students have to take proper care of the College property and must not cause any damage to the same.



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

- The college is a no smoking zone. Strict action shall be taken against any student found using abusive substance or having gutka etc.



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

This committee is tasked with overseeing the proper implementation of admission rules and ensuring a smooth admission process.
- Online Application and Merit-Based Admissions: The college invites online applications for admission through various channels such as newspapers, the college website, and local media. Admissions are strictly based on merit and adhere to the government's reservation policy.
- Equal Opportunity Cell and Reservation Policy: The college follows reservations guidelines in consultation with the Equal Opportunity Cell, ST, SC, and OBC Cells. The admission process is managed collaboratively by the admission committee, teachers, and non-teaching staff, with clear responsibilities assigned based on different admission lists.
- Scrutiny and Merit List Preparation: The admission committee meticulously reviews all submitted application forms and compiles a merit list of selected candidates. A waiting list is also prepared, and vacant seats, if any, are promptly filled from the waiting list.
- Eligibility Verification and Approval Process: Teachers assigned to duty verify candidate documents and certificates against university data to ascertain eligibility. The validated applications are then sent to the departmental teacher-in-charge for further validation. The stream's Teacher Convener approves the applications before final sign-off by the Principal.
- Administrative Support and Coordination: The administrative office department ensures the availability of computers and high-speed connectivity for smooth operations. It collaborates with other administrative units to handle document verification, fee payment, record-keeping, and issuance of ID and Library Cards. They also track confirmed admissions and withdrawals.
- **Student Involvement:** Student volunteers from organizations like NSS and NCC play a crucial role in the admission process. They provide counseling to prospective candidates and their parents, contributing to a supportive environment.
- **Logistical Support:** Selected teaching and non-teaching staff members are responsible for logistical support, ensuring that the process runs seamlessly.
- Error Elimination through Checks and Counterchecks: Multiple layers of checks and counterchecks at different stages of the admission process help identify and rectify errors, ensuring accuracy.










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
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#### Admission Procedure

A. The College offers four years B Com programme in both Morning Shift and Day Shift. A student can apply only for one of the Shifts (either Morning or Day but not both) for admission. Admission Committee reserves the right to accept or reject Application Forms if an applicant applies for both the shifts.

B. Candidates seeking admission to the College are to apply through online mode only. The prospectus and online admission form is available in the college website http://www.dhskcommercecollege.edu.in/webportal#r Candidates seeking admission in B.Com 1st semester will have to submit the online admission form by paying Rs. 300/- only as the application and prospectus fee ( The online admission form is subject to change or modifications as per the directions issued by the Government of Assam). Application and Prospectus fee can be paid through SBI Net Banking or by using Visa, RuPay, Mastercard or Maestro Credit or Debit card issued by any bank. The facility for submission of online application including payment of prospectus fee will be available in the college website. Candidates should keep a printout/hard copy of the submitted application for further reference. The list of selected candidates will be displayed in the college website as well as college notice board.

C. The selected candidates will be admitted provisionally. However, they must produce all the original documents on a date before beginning of classes which will be intimated later through the college website and notice board. The relevant documents are as follows:

- i) Mark Sheet(s) of last Board/Council examination(s) passed.
- ii) Pass Certificate and Character Certificate from the school/college last attended.



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iii) Age-proof Certificate.

- iv) Caste Certificate issued by the competent authority wherever applicable.
- v) Two recent passport size photographs.
- vi) Court Affidavit in case of any loss or gap in academic year.
- vii)Anti-ragging affidavit by the student on plain paper (format available in college website)
- viii) Candidates seeking admission under Sports/NCC/Scout & Guides/ Cultural/PH Quota must bring relevant documents.
- ix) Any other relevant documents.

Since admissions will be strictly provisional so in case of any discrepancies in the above documents the admission will be declared as null and void. And the admission fees once paid by the students will be forfeited.

D. Hitherto, fresh candidates belonging to the BPL category are offered free admission as per Government order. Such Government regulation is issued on year-to-year basis. This year's decision to offer free admission will depend upon the Government notification in this regard. Further instruction or information pertaining to free admission will be notified from time to time on receipt of the same from the Government.

E. The Admission Committee after scrutinizing all the Admission Forms submitted by the candidates will prepare the list of selected candidates for admission strictly based on merit. The Admission Committee also follows reservation rules as per Government norms. Waiting lists are also prepared and in case of any seat remains vacant will be filledup from the main list on the same day of admission or as notified by the College.



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#### F. Payment of Fees:

A selected candidate must pay the Admission Fee online via credit/debit card/net hankingas notified by the institution.

#### G. Direct Admission:

- (a) A portion of the total seats will be filled in through direct admissionprocess. The cut off percentage for direct admission will be communicated in the college website.
- (b) As the number of seats for direct admission are limited, admission will be given on the First Come, First Serve (FCFS)' basis (only through online mode)
- (c) The other portion of the total seats will be filled in as per the merit list to be notified through college website and the notice board after the process of direct admission is over.

After the verification is completed successfully, the students can complete the admission procedure by making payment of the admission fees online.

H. No student can claim admission into B. Com. Course on the ground of his/her being a student of this college in the H.S. Course.

L Canvassing in any form will lead to disqualification.



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#### Courses of Study

#### B.COM PROGRAM

As directed by the Government, New Education Policy (NEP) 2020, shall be implemented in the institution from this session and there will be changes in the curricula structure, syllabus, and assessment accordingly. The undergraduate degree will be of either 3 or 4-year duration, with multiple exit options within this period, with appropriate certifications, e.g., a certificate after completing 1 year in a discipline or field including vocational and professional areas, or a diploma after 2 years of study, or a Bachelor 's degree after a 3-year or 4-year program.

Since FYUP (under NEP) is in its nascent form, course related details that the college will offer, shall be communicated to students later.
